

What is a Family-School Compact?

A *School-Parent Compact for Achievement* is an agreement that parents, students and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards.

Effective compacts:

- Link to goals of the campus improvement plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parent can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

The parents, students and staff of Humphrey's Highland Elementary School developed this School-Parent Compact for Achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students told us what would help them learn. District Goals

Every campus will improve student performance on the STAAR/EOC assessment in each of the accountability groups as measured by:

- Increasing the number of students passing all tests until 95% are accomplishing this measure.
- Reducing the number of students failing more than 1 test.

At School

Humphrey’s Highland will work with students and their families to support students’ success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families are listed below.

-Weekly folders will be sent home to inform parents of student learning, activities and behavior.

-Parent trainings will be offered on ways they can support the child at home in math and reading. All the materials the parents will use at home will be provided in the training.

-Goals will be developed with students that focus on increasing their skills in reading and math. Assessment data will be used to develop these goals. Students will share their goals with their parents.

-Various family events will be held throughout the year that will provide the opportunity for parents, students and teachers to interact in a positive and educational setting.

At Home

Humphrey’s Highland Elementary parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students’ success.

- Use weekly folders to discuss my child’s learning, activities and behavior.
- Read with my child daily and ask questions about the text.
- Attend the family night events and participate in math and reading activities offered.
- Provide praise and encouragement.
- Use the math and reading programs children have access to at school (I-Station, Raz-Kids and/or Headsprout).
- Make sure my child is at school every day, on time and make sure to pick my child up on time.
- View my child’s progress online when possible.
